Lyttelton Port Company News

Update: June 29 Released

Operations are continuing well at the Lyttelton Port despite ongoing work throughout the port to repair damage from the February and June earthquakes and continuing aftershocks.

Shipping movements are continuing as normal, apart from coal exports. Operationally, we were up and running within 96 hours of both the February and June earthquakes, proving that the port is extremely resilient in terms of people, facilities and infrastructure. However, we have lost up to a third of our operating area at Cashin Quay to repair works.

The Port Company is facing a four to five year programme of repaving, repiling and rebuilding. Our responsibility to the people of Canterbury, as the largest trade gateway to the South Island, is to recover, grow and continue to contribute to people's economic wellbeing. Our staff and contractors continue their hard work to ensure that vital goods and commodities can move safely through the port, and we thank them for that.



Lyttelton's iconic and historic lighthouse has been removed temporarily to a safe place for rehabilitation.

The earthquakes left the lighthouse on a 15 degree lean as the timber roundhead structure that it sat on was pulled downwards by settlement of land near the wharf. Once the land and wharf structure at Z berth have been remediated, it will be returned there and will go back into operation.

The lighthouse is a listed international navigational aid and while it is out of commission a temporary light has been installed in its place. It was built around 1878. The light colour was changed from its original red to green when New Zealand adopted a new international standard for buoys and beacons in the early 1980s.
