Draft Master Plan Revealed

How Lyttelton Will Look in the Future

Lyttelton residents, building and business owners will get an opportunity this week to provide feedback on the Christchurch City Council Suburban Centres Programme [Lyttelton] Draft Master Plan framework they helped develop for earthquake damaged Lyttelton.

Hundreds of people took part in the council led workshops and focus group sessions held on The Grassy in May and June 2011 to put forward ideas and aspirations on how the Lyttelton commercial and business centre could be redeveloped.

Council have now pulled together the results of these community workshops and focus group sessions, financial models and research, to create an initial framework for the Lyttelton Draft Master Plan.

Following the release of the Draft Master Plan this week, community feedback will again be asked, with ideas and options further developed before being presented to Council for progress and implementation. Jenny Ridgen, Programme Manager Healthy Environment, says *“Involvement from the community has been crucial for the development of the draft Master Plans. It is now up to the community to let us know if we have got it right”*.

Lyttelton residents need to be aware that this document will form the basis for all post-quake redevelopment in the area. These meetings give us an opportunity to review what we have already had input to, and allow us time to give feedback on what the designers have come up with so far.

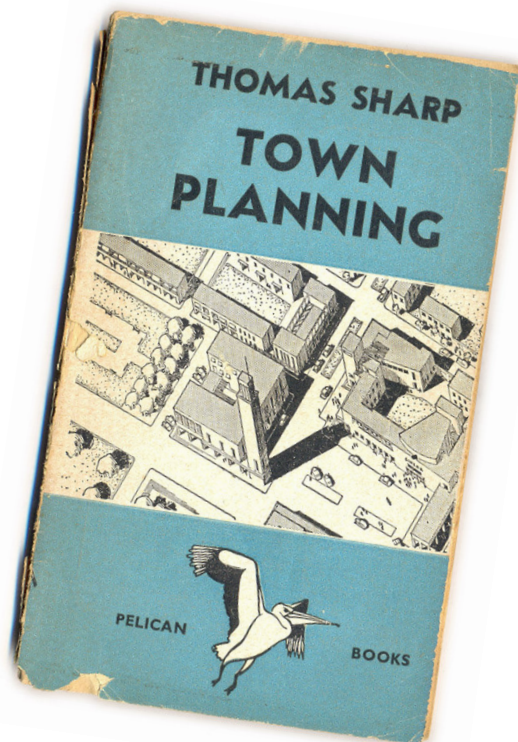
Important Note: This may be the only opportunity to have our voices heard - so if you are keen to have a say, we cannot stress enough that it is important to attend.

You'll find Deborah with all the lovely second hand books in the room towards the back of the Portico shop - so be sure to pop in and catch up with Deborah when you are next in London Street.

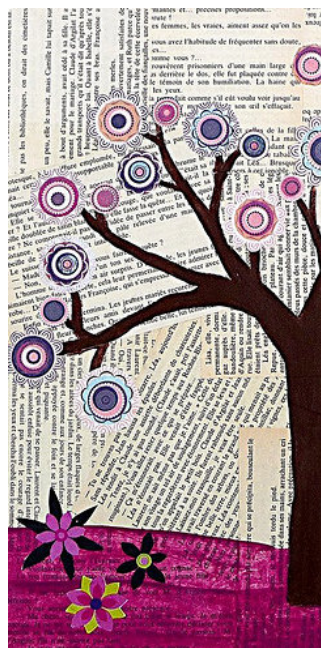
Creative Collage

Productivity Commission Examines Performance of International Freight

Local authority ownership of ports, and the ways in which competition, co-operation and regulation play out in international freight transport are scrutinised in an Issues Paper released by the Productivity Commission today. The Commission wants public submissions on the Issues Paper to shape its inquiry into the performance of international freight transport services.

Releasing the Issues Paper, Commission Chairman Murray Sherwin said the inquiry would explore some important and contentious issues for New Zealand's international freight industry. It puts all components of the international supply chain under the microscope.

“This is an important inquiry for New Zealand. We live in the most remote developed country in the world and the way we get our products to and from international markets is critical to our success,” Mr Sherwin said. “Better performance in freight transport should result in lower prices for imported goods, higher profits for exporting industries, and quicker freight turnaround – benefiting importers, exporters, employees and consumers.

“New Zealand exporters and importers currently spend about \$5 billion on freight each year. We're looking at whether these costs can be lowered and the services improved.” One of the questions the Issues Paper asks is whether council ownership is getting in the way of ports and airports performing more efficiently to help exporters and importers. It asks whether ports need to be more collaborative and innovative to improve performance, which is lagging behind that of ports in some other countries.

The paper also asks if regulatory arrangements are adequate to deal with anti-competitive behaviour in the international freight industries and whether the Minister of Transport should continue to exercise certain regulatory functions, or hand these over to the Commerce Commission. “The inquiry will help ensure that New Zealand has the best regulatory framework and the right incentives to achieve best practice across the industry. It will also help to drive improvements in infrastructure investment, innovation and supply-chain coordination,” Mr Sherwin said.

The issues paper is the first step in the inquiry process. It elaborates on the context for the inquiry, the approach that the Commission intends to take, and identifies key questions. The Commission encourages New Zealanders to get involved in the inquiry. For a copy of the Issues Paper, including information on making a submission, visit www.productivity.govt.nz The Commission is due to release its draft recommendations for improving the performance of international freight transport services in December this year. It will deliver its final report and recommendations to the Government in April 2012.

Bread Maker Bread

Nothing says welcome home than the smell of freshly baked bread. Dust off the bread maker, give this recipe a go, and show the kids how 'real' bread can develop:

- 1 heaped tsp active dried yeast
- Tiny pinch of Vitamin C powder (from the Herb Centre)
- 1 tbsp raw sugar or molasses
- 4 cups organic white flour or whole wheat flour
- 1 tbsp butter or oil
- 1 tsp salt
- 1½ cups of lukewarm water (slightly more for whole wheat flour)

Put all this, in order, into your bread maker.

Put on long setting (3½ hours).
