Lyttelton Draft Master Plan

Residents Review the New Concept

Hundreds of Lyttelton Harbour residents submitted ideas for the redevelop and rebuild of Lyttelton township following the February 22 earthquake. Over the past week the Christchurch City Council have held a series of meetings to present the outcome of feedback received by residents. Healthy Environment Programme Manager, Jenny Ridgen, said more than 200 people came to two Lyttelton meetings on Wednesday.

Wendy Everingham, from the Lyttelton Harbour Information Centre, commented that Lyttelton residents are really engaging with the Master Plan process, and that "the turn out for the three



meetings this week has been really encouraging". Wendy says "it was great to be presented with some really new ideas, while gaining more public space in Lyttelton was a highlight of the options presented. The idea of a roof top garden between the library and the Council Service Centre so that we get public waterfront views from London Street was really innovative. The creation of a town space between the Recreation Centre and the former Albion site was also a great idea. Feedback from attendees seems to have been really positive with many comments such as, "much better than I would have ever thought", time after time from attendees."

The plan presented by the design team from Council is just the beginning of a basic concept plan. If you were unable to make the three presentations held last week, or have further feedback you still have the option to get your views included in the plan. It is expected that the slide show from the meetings will be loaded onto the Christchurch City Council website, and we will let you know when this happens. You will have two weeks from the time the presentation is available to make further comments/suggestions about what has been proposed. Hard copies will be placed at the library and the Lyttelton Harbour Information Centre, where you will be able to read the proposals and leave your comments on the forms provided. At this stage the feedback forms are located at the London Street Dairy. Community Board members are also planning to be at the library, at times yet to be announced, so that you can speak directly to them about the plan. For times they will be there keep an eye on the library notice board.

If you want to contact the design team directly their email is <u>suburbancentres@ccc.govt.nz</u>. The design team genuinely want to know your views about what they have proposed, and are keen for the Harbour community to "own this plan" so that we can work together to create the shared vision. Feedback will be used to prepare a draft master plan, which would be put out for consultation in September. A final version of the plans would then be put before the council in October.

Gap Filler Comes to Lyttelton

Creative Urban Regeneration

Gap Filler is a creative urban regeneration initiative started in response to the September 4, 2010 Canterbury earthquake, and revised and expanded in light of the more destructive February 22, 2011 quake. It is now administered by the Gap Filler Charitable Trust. Gap Filler aims to temporarily activate vacant sites within Christchurch with creative projects, to make for a more interesting, dynamic and vibrant city.

Gap Filler will see vacant sites - awaiting redevelopment as a result of the many earthquakes or otherwise - utilised for temporary, creative, people-centred purposes. Working with local community groups, artists, architects, landowners, librarians, designers, engineers, dancers anyone with an idea and initiative! Gap Filler lower the barriers, by handling the legal contracts and liability insurance, to help ideas become a reality.

Gap Filler is temporary in nature, seeking to activate vacant sites for relatively short periods, to demonstrate that the city can grow in important ways without large capital expenditure or major construction. Gap Filler projects can pop up as spaces become available around the city. All projects will be able to occupy or vacate a site quickly.

Last Saturday, under the guidance of Trent Hiles [Harbour Arts Collective] the former site of Ground (Albion Building) under went a transformation into a community space called the Lyttelton Petanque Club. Designed for everyone to enjoy the event was organised by Gap Filler, working with a small group of Lyttelton locals.

Once a completely vacant site, the corner location offers a space with tables, seating, petanque field and a stage for busking, poetry or music - with thanks to many, many local hands who donated their skills and time.

Trent Hiles is passionate about turning the vacant sites in Lyttelton from bland to exciting and interesting. Keep an eye out for Trent's work on the Harbour Light site, London Street, and a small section on Canterbury Street.

Apparently the Antarctic weather that battered the Lyttelton Harbour this weekend proved to be the worst snow fall in fifteen years, blanketing the Christchurch region on Sunday night with up to 30cm of snow.

Motorists were warned they may have to stay off Christchurch roads for up to two days as ice and snow make driving conditions dangerous. A Christchurch City Council spokeswoman advised residents to stay at home, especially in our eastern suburbs, which already had poor road conditions due to the earthquakes.

Snow clearing and gritting was in progress in Christchurch, with crews concentrating on the arterial roads and the hills. Police said conditions could only be described as "slippery and treacherous", with the hill suburb roads being closed.

A spokeswomen for lines company Orion stated Power was cut to parts of Christchurch, with homes in Belfast, Spencerville and Marshland without power since 11.43pm Sunday night, and by mid Monday up to 2,000 homes remained without power.

Crews were working to restore power as soon as possible. And Orion General Manager Commercial, Rob Jamieson, said only minor network damage had been found at this stage and crews were working as quickly as possible to restore power to the affected areas.

Christchurch, Dunedin and Queenstown Airports had closed with flights badly disrupted, while flights out of Invercargill were experiencing delays. Christchurch Airport expected flights to resume later in the day, but at the time this went to press, the airport was still assessing the situation.

Starting the day at -2.0 degrees, with an expected high of 2.0 degrees, Metservice is predicting a frosty start to Tuesday, but clearing and improving through the week.

By the time we get to Friday 29 July - the weather is looking all clear for the Festival of Lights!


Law Commission Review

In recognition of the number of community groups within the Lyttelton Harbour region we bring you this newsflash from the Law Commission, as you might be a registered incorporated society or charitable trust; or wish to be in the future:

Currently much of the not-for-profit sector in New Zealand is governed by the century old Incorporated Societies Act 1908 – an Act which the Law Commission argues is in need of major reform. Professor McLay said preliminary consultation and research suggested there were a number of problems with the old Act including the lack of adequate processes for dealing with conflicts of interests and resolving internal disputes. "Getting basic governance structures right, understanding what is appropriate conduct for those who govern societies, and providing for suitable mechanisms for resolving disputes is critical for all organisations, especially those which seek government or other sponsorship. "The 1908 Act, in our view, does not require societies to ask the appropriate questions when they are being set up. Nor does it provide incentives for already existing societies to improve."

The Commission is seeking feedback on a range of issues and options for reform raised in the paper including: Whether all societies should, as a condition of incorporation, be subject to certain minimum governance rules that they cannot vary; Whether a new Act ought to provide a code that makes the obligations of committee members clearer; How the Act should provide for the resolution of disputes between members and their societies; What rules societies ought to be required to have in their constitution, and the nature of those rules.
