You had to be there. It's Friday night and cars from the city are streaming nose to tail through the Lyttelton Tunnel to experience the Festival of Lights. And what an experience it was. From Dublin Street walking down toward London Street you could feel the excitement building. Passing the Lyttelton Harbour Information Centre port-a-com, the white angel in the window brought a smile to faces. At the Fire Station people paused to marvel at the irony of the flashing lights and smoke machine pumping away inside the building; and across the road the crew at St Johns were admired for parking the ambulance on the road with all the lights ablaze. What a year these two hero organisations have had. It was heart warming and poignant to walk to the festival past these two displays of unity with the community.

Reaching London Street and the vibe on the street was lively, inquisitive and at the same time, relaxed. People were here to have a good time, and the months of hard work by organisers had ensured the people were not disappointed. Street vendors of all varieties, combined with London Street business owners, offered a variety of delectable food and drinks. In behind the Volcano Cafe stall, braziers were glowing away in the dark offering a warm reprieve with a mug of their famous mulled wine in hand. Families discovered the Lyttelton Petanque Club on the corner Albion site, now presented with tables, chairs and plantings.

Once again the Lyttelton Port Company organised and sponsored the much anticipated event of the evening, the Lyttelton Port of Christchurch Fireworks Extravaganza. And what a display it was. Delighting the crowds, young or old, the annual fireworks display received a chorus of appreciation from the thousands of people attending the Festival of Lights. With empty building sites turned into visual displays, and Lyttelton's home-grown musicians and performers giving it everything on the London Street stage, the brief rain showers through the night failed to dampen the spirits as the crowd celebrated, laughed and danced the night away.

Congratulations to Project Lyttelton for organising another successful event, while giving Lyttelton and Christchurch visitors alike a reason to celebrate life in Canterbury, and to bring a smile to earthquake weary faces. The Christchurch City Council is proposing a permanent ban on drinking in public places in the Okains Bay area every New Year's Eve.

The proposed ban would apply to the Okains Bay beach and reserve area from 5pm on 31 December until 7am on 1 January each year.

The amendment to the 2009 Alcohol Restrictions in Public Places Bylaw will help prevent disorderly and anti-social behaviour arising from the consumption of alcohol.

Christchurch Mayor Bob Parker says the proposed ban will encourage more families back to Okains Bay.

"It's such a great spot for a family break. Christchurch families have enjoyed Okains Bay as a New Year's Eve holiday location for years, but the increase in anti-social drinking behaviour can be off-putting for families.

"The temporary alcohol ban that was put in place last year worked extremely well, and families were able to celebrate safely without any of the problems associated with excess drinking.

"It is our intention to reduce alcohol-related harm and disorder on New Year's Eve in Okains Bay and to assist the Police in maintaining community wellbeing in this popular holiday spot."

The Alcohol Restrictions in Public Places Amendment (Okains Bay) Bylaw 2011 will go out for public consultation 9 August – 12 September.

If the proposed amendment is adopted, the Permanent Alcohol Ban will take effect from New Year's Eve 2011/12 onwards.

“ recipe ”

Prune and Date Chocolate Sponge

- 100g prunes
- 100g dates
- 275ml apple juice
- 100g wholemeal flour
- 25g cocoa or carob powder
- rind of one orange
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 50ml oil
- 150ml water
- 75g molasses sugar

Soak prunes in apple juice for at least 6 hours till swollen and plump. Preheat oven to 180 C. Grease a 1L ovenproof dish. Heat water, oil and sugar together until sugar melts. Do not boil. Leave to cool. Stew prunes in apple juice for 10 minutes till soft. Remove from juice and de-stone Chop roughly. Add dates to remaining apple juice and stew 5 minutes until juice is dissolved. Mix dates and prunes and spread on base of dish. Sieve cocoa and baking powder and add flour and rind. Stir in the COLD sugar liquid to form thick sponge batter. Spread sponge on top of the fruit and bake 30-40 minutes until risen and firm.

Serve with soya custard or orange sauce.
