Lyttelton Draft Master Plan

Five Days to Have Your Say

Various meetings held since February 22nd have focused on the recovery and development of Lyttelton. As a result of these meetings, the document entitled “Suburban Centres Programme - Lyttelton Draft Master Plan” has in the last week been made available for comment by the Christchurch City Council.

Lyttelton residents have until 5pm Friday 12 August [that's this Friday] to make any comments on the draft master plan. After this deadline, the collective design team will presume that residents are in complete agreement with the draft master plan, and it will be presented to Council for consideration.

Please note Council is not bound to proceed with any prospective idea detailed in the presentation summary. Decisions as to whether or not an action will be taken forward into the Draft Master Plan remains with the Council.

Deadline for feedback on the Lyttelton Draft Master Plan is due Friday 12th August. This is not your last chance to influence the outcome, as there will be an opportunity to make a formal submission when the Draft Master Plan is finalised later in the year. However, having your say at the development stage will be of benefit to the planners in understanding what the Lyttelton community wishes to see happen, which in turn directs the conversations held with Council.

The Draft Master Plan encompasses five main elements: Natural Environment; Community Well Being; Movement Environment; Economy and Business; Built Environment. These five elements are outlined as follows:

NATURAL ENVIRONMENT

- Natural Capital - Supporting local biodiversity and ecosystem services where possible; providing green spaces which support wildlife and the experience of natural heritage;
- Resource Sustainability - Reducing reliance on fossil fuels and the use of non-renewable resources and energy; improving air quality; minimising water use and waste; support for green building initiatives
- Lifestyles - Improving opportunities for play and exercise; encouraging cycle and walking opportunities; accessible and diverse open places and spaces
- Food Security - Access to wholesome, affordable and locally-produced food; safeguarding productive soils; finding sites for community food production

COMMUNITY WELL BEING

- Public Services - Enhancing access to quality public services and facilities -social, educational, recreational and health; co-locating community services, facilities and businesses
- Social and Community Capital - Building strong social connections -supporting social cohesion and building social capital; supporting and providing opportunities for social interaction, leisure, engagement and shared decision-making
- Community Resilience - Planning and preparing for future disasters and climatic changes
- Cultural Diversity - Inclusion, acceptance and tolerance of ethnicity, socio-economic status and personal characteristics; ensuring tangata whenua contributions; reflecting the principles of the Treaty of Waitangi

MOVEMENT ENVIRONMENT

- Active public transport - Promoting affordable, frequent and reliable public transport
- Parking - Providing convenient on and off-street parking opportunities for the commercial core to encourage people to stop and spend
- Accessibility for all - Find balance between the needs of local communities, economies and interests and the higher order city-wide transport networks; Reinforce entry, departure, identity and local stories within the street; Strengthen connections and route choice; Put people first
- Strategic network - Enable the economically vital movement of freight between the port, state highway, tunnel and arterial networks whilst finding ways to create safe, buffered footpaths and cycle lanes which maximises amenity

ECONOMY AND BUSINESS

- Economic Development - Businesses, quality employment and job security; Creating opportunities for training and employment; encouraging business opportunities - new businesses and supporting existing
- Equity - Fairness to current and future community; improving housing standards; supporting employment and educational opportunities

BUILT ENVIRONMENT

- Neighbourhood Amenity - Well-designed public amenities; consistency with the Urban Design Protocol; reflecting neighbourhood identity; maintaining and future proofing heritage features; rebuilding neighbourhood
- Housing Stock - Affordable, efficient, secure, dry and warm accommodation; upgrading existing housing stock; finding opportunities for more efficient use of land for housing
- Community Safety - Reducing crime rates and using CPTED principles; traffic calming techniques

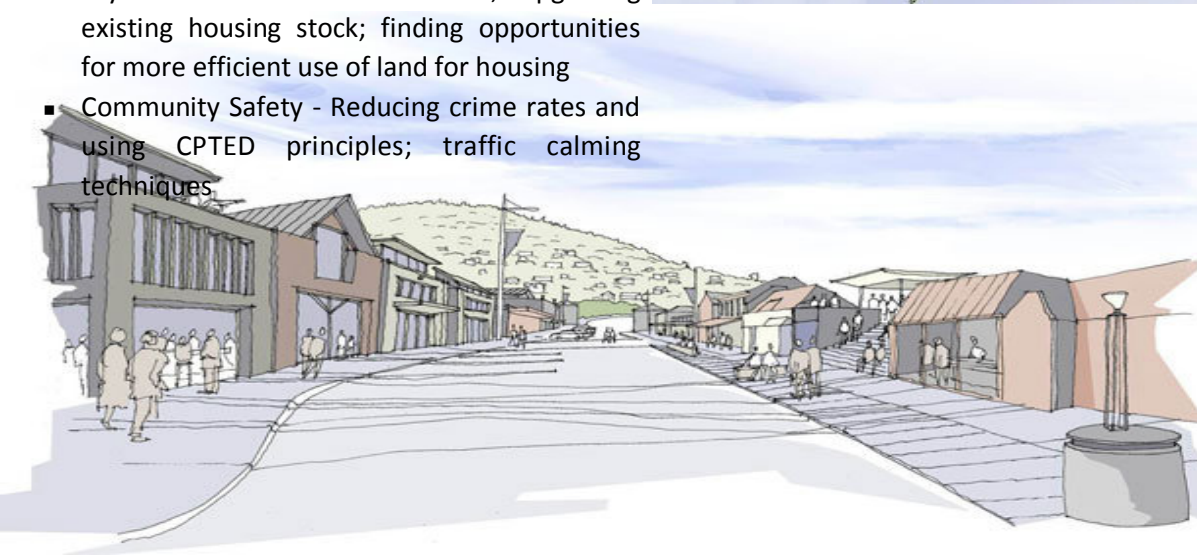

Be Yourself

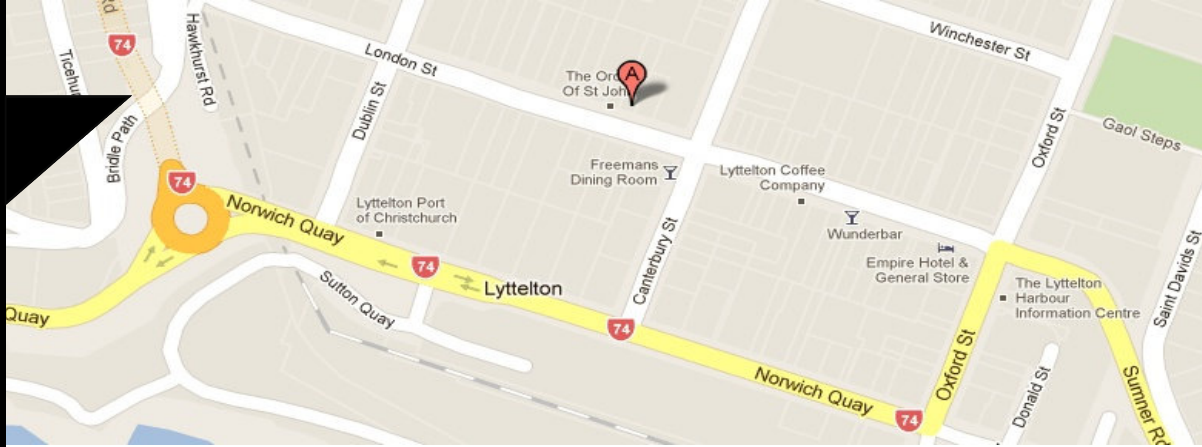
Why would you want

One Very Special Visit

Governor-General in Lyttelton



It's not every day that the Governor-General Sir Anand Satyanand, and his wife, Lady Satyanand visit Lyttelton, and on Friday 5th August, it was the perfect day for a visit.

At the Lyttelton Main School around 250 pupils from both Lyttelton West and Lyttelton Main welcomed them with a powhiri. Governor General Satyanand addressed the school saying *"We have come to offer our support to those grievously affected by the earthquake. It is important for all of you to realise that New Zealanders everywhere feel for you and want to acknowledge the efforts being made by your parents to make sure this area will thrive and be as wonderful a place as it was 150 years ago. It's a historic part of our country"*.

From the Lyttelton Main school, the group walked down London Street and were treated to an impromptu rehearsal of the last act of Macbeth. The Loons production company making the most of the now vacant sections where Volcano Cafe, Lyttelton Fisheries and Coastal Living once proudly stood. As the Governor General Satyanand watched from the footpath he exclaimed with a warming smile *"I think that was a wonderful symbol of the community's optimism. This is a place that has had some terrible damage, but in a way, the people of Lyttelton are getting on with recovery"*.

Onto the Lyttelton St John Ambulance Station, and the Governor General was introduced to members of the Lyttelton Mt Herbert Community Board; the St Johns Operations team; the Lyttelton Volunteer Fire Brigade and members from Lyttelton Civil Defence.

Here at the Lyttelton Harbour Information Centre, we were delighted to have been included on the list of introductions. Having watched the Governor General walk down London Street, our small gathering of volunteers and representatives from the Lyttelton Harbour Information Centre, Project Lyttelton and the Historic Places Trust were all smiles at the arrival of the Governor General. During introductions to members of Project Lyttelton the Governor General and Lady Satyanand were presented with fine examples of Lyttelton Hearts - the ones that were so uplifting to see following Februarys devastation; and a touching gesture received well by their excellencies.

While meeting the Lyttelton Harbour Information Centre volunteers, the Governor General emphasised the importance of both volunteers in the community, and having a reference point for the community to source information, especially in times like these. Despite the images of destruction and loss, Governor General Satyanand told the group that he was impressed at the sense of forward motion, signs of optimism and the kiwi can-do attitude demonstrated by the number of businesses and organisations who were establishing themselves in port-a-coms - identifying with our new normal.

Viewing images presented by the Historic Places Trust on the deconstruction of the Lyttelton Time Ball Station, both the Governor General and Lady Satyanand admired the amount of work being undertaken to save the building, and expressed compassion for the loss of an historic icon. Upon being presented with a booklet on the history of the Time Ball Station, it was expressed the booklet would find a special place in the library at the Governor Generals residence.

Friday's visit represented the last visit to Canterbury before the term of Governor General ends for Sir Anand Satyanand later this month. Despite shuffling schedules, we were all delighted to have had the opportunity to meet their excellencies, and we parted with a sense of pride that he took the time to see our corner of paradise.

Baked Rice Pudding

Here's a winter warming dessert treat the whole family will love. It's easy on the budget too:

- 3 cups cooked brown rice
- 2 cups soy milk
- pinch of salt
- ¼ cup malt syrup
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
