

A Life of Hurdles; Compassion; Fish and Chips

Today we heard the most remarkable story from our own Peter Rea. Some of you will know Peter who has worked in the port since 1972. He recently retired from ISS-McKay where he was best known for looking after cruise ship visits. The story that unfolded began in 1989 when a refugee from Vietnam, Viet Bui, escaped his country and made it by boat to Japan after being picked up at sea by a Japanese Navy vessel. He received refugee status in New Zealand some 10 years later.



It was not long before he was given immigration clearance to return to Vietnam, marry his girl friend and bring her to Christchurch in 1999. With little money the couple received some help from their lawyer and few Vietnamese friends and they managed to buy the Fish and Chip shop called Lyttelton Sea Foods, then in London Street next door to Leslies Bookshop. This is where Peter Rea first encountered the Duong family. They shared a parking garage together. Peter got to know the couple, their two baby girls and some of the relatives. The family prospered and with hard work were able to buy a home in Brookhaven. In 2005 the family took a well earned holiday intending to travel to Vietnam and then USA to join up with other family members.

But this is where the families luck started to turn. While on their stop over in Vietnam, Viet died unexpectedly of a brain aneurism. The wife, our own Phuong Duong or Donna as she is known affectionately, was left with the two very young children and a then unknown large debt. With little command of English and her two small children she returned to her home in Brookhaven and stayed home raising her babies. Life wasn't easy.

When the girls were old enough to attend school in 2007 Donna heard Lyttelton Sea Foods was up for sale again and bought it back with her late husband's life insurance money. Peter was amazed to see her back but most of all the ladies determination to operate a Fish and Chip business with such limited English on her own. Concerned, Peter let her know if she needed help she only had to ask. Sensing the pressure was getting too much for Donna in 2008 Peter managed, with some difficulty, to get her older sister living in Vietnam a two months special purposes visa. Her visit brought some happiness into Donna's troubled life.

If you thought that was the end of it the second tragedy was about to unfold in Donna's life. Her husband had lent money, amounting to half the value of her home, to his sister before his death. Donna thinking that money was being paid back suddenly received a call from the United States saying that due to the financial crash there was no money to pay it back and the call ended abruptly. There was no security or receipt of any kind for this lending.

Peter encountered a very distraught Donna at the back of her shop with her girls, wanting to end it all and inconsolable. After managing to bring some order Peter set about sorting things out and do what he could over the next months. He helped the family negotiate a sale of their home, pay off some of the debt and relocate into another home with a small mortgage while Donna continued to work at the shop.

Just when things were looking up for everyone the September earthquake hit closing her shop for three weeks then the February earthquake struck putting her out of business for good. Peter now retired and knowing how much Donna had put into the business set about to get her up and running again.

You can never tell Peter Rea that you can't do something. This strong willed man set about to guide Donna through the maze of re-starting a business in Lyttelton! We all know this is not easy after the earthquakes, let alone with a venture like a Fish and Chip shop in a port-a-com when all advice was that it was going to be too hard.

Peter stuck at it and was able to weave his way through all the relocation and building hurdles. For getting the port-a-com Fish and Chip shop up and running again Peter pays tribute to many people, for without their advice and help he says he could not have done the job. In particular Lyttelton's co-operative and problem solving compassionate people got to it and have enabled this business to re-open and support this family again.

Whilst love is an often unused word in the world we reside in, this story really demonstrates love and respect for each other in action. Peter Rea has overturned so many hurdles to keep this family safe and cared for. Its true that "Actions speak louder than words especially in these situations" say Peter.

Cool Store on Z-Berth

Cool Store Relocation Causes Controversy

Public Access to Inner Harbour Slipway Questioned

Due to wharf damage following the September and February earthquakes, the 3,000 tonne capacity cool store situated on Z-Berth at the entrance to the Port of Lyttelton wharf needs a new location.

Original discussions between the Lyttelton Port Company and the Christchurch City Council involved the purchase of a section of land along Cyrus William Quay, in the location of the old cattle jetty. Initial thoughts were that this land purchase would effectively close access to the inner harbour slipway.

On October 5th the Lyttelton Mt Herbert Community Board held an extraordinary meeting to enable a replacement cool store to be built on the inner harbour foreshore, near the old cattle jetty. Land will be sold to the Lyttelton

Port Company who will amalgamate the former roadway with adjacent land and lease both areas to Independent Fisheries.

Boaties who use the small slipway next to Starks to haul their boats out during southerly conditions will still be able to do so when required, and there will still be public access to the inner harbour foreshore at the end of George Seymour Quay.

The community board asked that proceeds from the sale of the land be held over to purchase other land in the vicinity. At the meeting the Community Board learned that Christchurch City Council staff and staff from Lyttelton Port Company have been in discussions about possible land exchanges to rationalise holdings in the Naval Point area, which should result in better public use.

Final Farewell

Holy Trinity Lyttelton

Every Sunday morning the bells at the Anglican Holy Trinity Church in Lyttelton would proudly ring out to remind people to head along for Sunday service; or to simply wake the community from it's slumber. Either way, many of us miss this Sunday morning ritual.

Back in 1852 the original church was built from wood and brick but the timber proved to be very green, and shrank, so swayed spectacularly in the high winds. The congregation would assemble in terror and eventually the church was deemed unsafe, and was pulled down just five years later in 1857. In 1860 the church was rebuilt from red rock sourced from local quarries, and sandstone from Quail Island. It was the oldest stone church in the Canterbury area; forming a significant part of Lyttelton's history.

Lyttelton's landmark red stone church will receive a final farewell and deconsecrated service on Tuesday evening at 7.30pm. Everyone in the community is warmly welcomed to attend.

The future of a new church is very uncertain so it would be wonderful for the Anglican Bishop to see how much this church was valued, and remembered, in this community.

Lyttelton Time Ball

Lost Icon Update

The devastating earthquakes, particularly 22nd February this year, caused a tragic loss of life. There was also significant damage to many heritage buildings. The 6.3 magnitude earth quake on 13 June further compounded the many issues facing the region, and also put back the plans for heritage properties already damaged and ready for repair.

The New Zealand Historic Places Trust faces similar challenges to those faced by other heritage owners, the business community and all Cantabrians. Dealing with insurance, assessing the cost of restoration, liaising with contractors and revenue issues are all issues the New Zealand Historic Places Trust shares along with thousands of others in the region.

For 135 years Lyttelton residents and visitors to the port settlement have looked up to the spur above Officers Point and marvelled at the Time Ball Station. Now, the visual reality of the seismic activity that has rocked Canterbury since 4 September 2010 is plain to see. Work on dismantling the Time Ball Station began in June. Now, much of the iconic landmark's heritage fabric has been removed and put into storage. Except for the former wash-house, there is little in the way of recognisable features of what previously stood.

These are sad times for Time Ball Station Manager Jan Titus, other Time Ball staff and the wider Lyttelton community who share the sense of loss of the world famous landmark. The site closed following the 4 September earthquake last year, with many chattels removed at the time. Extensive damage from the 22 February quake compounded the earlier damage, leading to dismantling as the only option.

On 13 June successive quakes resulted in the tower collapsing as dismantling continued. For Jan it literally is a case of picking up the pieces and carrying on. While looking ahead to a time when the Time Ball Station returns in some form seems some time away, it is motivation to keep on going. "I don't know what to say really," Jan muses as she stands on the floorboards in what was the Time Ball Station kitchen. "It has been cold and our staff have had to work under trying conditions to ensure as much of the Time Ball Station fabric is retrieved so that it could potentially be returned to the site. Like many people in Lyttelton and Canterbury we face the same issues in dealing with our personal situations as well as working towards achieving the best results at the Time Ball Station".

"We are recording what comes off the site and goes into storage facilities. We label every item so that it can be easily retrieved once a final decision is made on the site's future. "There are lots of pieces of timber, brick, walls, windows, pieces of roof. There's tonnes of stuff that's broken but we are trying to retain and record what we can. It's progressively getting difficult to work out what piece is what and where it belongs now."

Once the site is cleared the damaged retaining wall will be made safe. "It would be great to initially establish it as a green site so the people of Lyttelton and visitors can come up here and use it again. With summer coming it is a great place to come with a picnic and enjoy the activity and beautiful views of the harbour," Jan says. "There is a huge local desire to see the time ball mechanism return in some form."

Keeping Boats Off the Rocks

The harbourmaster has installed a new marker buoy at the end of the Naval Point rock breakwater to the east of the marina. It is a green buoy with a light with the same characteristics as the previous light on a stake on the breakwater. The buoy marks the end of the underwater section of the breakwater. It is green which means leave it to Starboard as you approach from the direction of the ocean. Don't go between it and the shore unless you want to check the depth of your keel against the rocks.

Water Restrictions

Level 3 Water Restriction Announced

Water restrictions will start on 8 October 2011 this year.

Christchurch's water supply systems were badly damaged during the 4 September, 22 February and 13 June earthquakes, the results of which have meant water restrictions are being imposed for the city for the first time since the drought of 1998.

The infrastructure required to pump water around the city on a peak-demand summer day, has been severely damaged by earthquakes over the last 12 months. We need to reduce the outdoor water consumption across the city this summer, as the damaged water infrastructure can not support this level of demand over the summer months.

The restrictions are necessary to ensure the Council can supply Christchurch residents with the indoor water they need as summer approaches. If residents do not comply with the restrictions from October, watering bans may have to be imposed for the city.

Level 3 Water Restriction - Alternate day hand-held hosing only

Hand-held hoses may only be used on alternative days.

Even numbered properties - hand-held watering only on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays. Odd numbered properties - hand-held watering only on Wednesdays, Fridays and Sundays. Unattended hoses, sprinklers, and garden irrigation systems are not permitted at any time.



What is Time Banking?

Time Banking is a way of trading skills in a community. It uses time, rather than money, as the measurement tool. Members of a Time Bank share their skills with other members within the community and are given time credits for the work they do. With the credits they gain, each member can 'buy' someone else's time, and get the service they need.

Why Join Lyttelton Time Bank?

Time Banking adds a richness to Time Bankers' lives. As a concept it brings 'wealth', in the form of friendship, caring for one another, having our needs met from within our own community and getting help with things we can't do. Skills that are often taken for granted are valued - especially non-market economy skills - like mothering, basic home help and caring, friendliness, listening.

In Lyttelton as a result of the Time Bank we can see a tighter community forming. Friendships are forming between people of different backgrounds who would not usually have met. The elderly are being cared for and the skills they share are valued. Special needs people are encouraged to participate. Time Banking builds relationships and trust in a community. Everyone has something they can contribute to the wellbeing of the whole.

Everyone's Time is Equal

With Time Banking everybody's time is equal, no matter what type of work is done. 1 = 1. If you give one hour's work, you receive one hour time credit. If you have another member do one hour's work, they are paid one hour time credit. Every person is equally valued.

Here are a few examples of what Lyttelton Harbour residents are giving and receiving this week - can you help?
