For Urgent Sale: Macbeth Performance Structure

Good Sort Needed - Donor or Purchaser: As Good Intentions Turn into a Nightmare

A project that started with great community intentions has quickly turned into a nightmare. The Loons, with the help of Pete Evans, secured precious community earthquake funding from Project Lyttelton to purchase a cover for an outdoor stage. The cover enabled the very successful production of Macbeth to take place in Lyttelton for the Arts Festival. All was going well, the stage was erected and the show played on. The bills were paid and then the show finished at the end of September.

Project Lyttelton and Pete Evans were both keen to enable Lyttelton to maintain this temporary stage so that more shows could be performed and the community would have another focal point until The Loons could reopen. Money raised by the Matakana Market for Lyttelton earthquake recovery was earmarked for more live performances in Lyttelton, and so this money was allocated to keep the structure going.

We all hoped the stage could remain and the shows could continue on.

That's when the red tape started to get in the way. No longer was the stage considered a temporary structure. A building permit, structural engineering report, fire reports, inspections etc were new requirements from the council. Our desire to keep shows rolling was stalled.

Too expensive, time consuming and frustrating. Two weeks ago the decision was made to sell the stage cover and just wind the site up. Two weeks of Trade Me later, there is still no buyer, but the debts keep mounting.

Unless a buyer or a donor can be found we are going to have to use vital community funding to pay off the structure. Is there anyone out there who would like to help, or a community, or project that has need of such a structure? It can readily be reconstructed in a day. It will already be deconstructed and can be picked up with a normal trailer.

Holy Trinity Remembered

A Family Recollection

As we come to terms with the loss of so many beautiful places in Lyttelton, it's great to hear peoples' stories of what was special about the place for them. This is Wendy Souter's story that she shared at the recent farewell service. Wendy known to many of us as the Receptionist at the Lyttelton Medical Centre has had a life long a long association with Holy Trinity Church.



Holy Trinity and My Family - Wendy Souter

My Great Grandparents settled in Wellington from the United Kingdom in about 1840. They moved down to Lyttelton sometime before 1850. My grandfather was a boatman and he rowed the new immigrants from the First Four Ships into Lyttelton. I can still see their picture in my Grandmother's house in the "Front Room" as they called it then.

They worshipped in Holy Trinity Church as did my Grandmother and her family. My mother followed in her footsteps, then myself, my two children and three grandchildren. All have been part of the worship here. Six generations in total! The family have celebrated baptisms, weddings and farewelled loved ones at funerals.

Over the last twenty years or so I have been involved in the music playing the organ. I spent many lunch times during the week in the beautiful church practising the hymns for the following Sunday. The Church always had a calming affect on you in all its beauty.

I feel blessed at the history of my involvement at this place and it is sad to see the impact of the earthquakes on the church but buildings can be replaced, it's the people that are the most important part.

In June, the Council approved the Suburban Centres Recovery Programme, including the preparation of a master plan for Lyttelton in recognition of the earthquake damage sustained to its town centre. The ideas, aspirations and feedback you provided at public meetings in June and July for the rebuild and recovery of Lyttelton have now been developed into the Draft Lyttelton Master Plan. The draft master plan sets out a vision for the rebuild and recovery of Lyttelton, plus the goals and actions needed to achieve it.

On 27 October the Council approved the draft master plan for community consultation. Now is your opportunity to tell us what you think of it. Submissions on it will be sought from Saturday, 19 November 2011 until 5.00pm on Monday, 19 December 2011. Information about the draft master plan and how to lodge a submission will be posted to Lyttelton Harbour property owners and to people and organisations with a particular interest in the draft master plan prior to Saturday 19 November 2011.

ARE YOU READY FOR THE UPCOMING REFERENDUM?

General Elections will be held on Saturday 26th November. And this year there is a referendum taking place at the same time. The Referendum gives you the chance to have your say on the voting system we use to elect our Parliaments in the future.

In the Referendum, you will be asked two questions:

- The first question asks whether you want to keep MMP (which is the voting system we use at the moment) or whether you want to change to another voting system.
- The second question asks which of four other voting systems you would choose if New Zealand decides to change from the Mixed Member Proportional (MMP) system:
 - First Past the Post (FPP)
 - Preferential Vote (PV)
 - Single Transferable Vote (STV)
 - Supplementary Member (SM)

It is really important to answer both questions. If more than half the voters want to change the system the answer you make for question two will determine the system that will operate. This will happen either by a new referendum in 2014 where you will be given the option of choosing MMP or the most popular system nominated at the referendum or by Parliament making a decision about the most popular option.

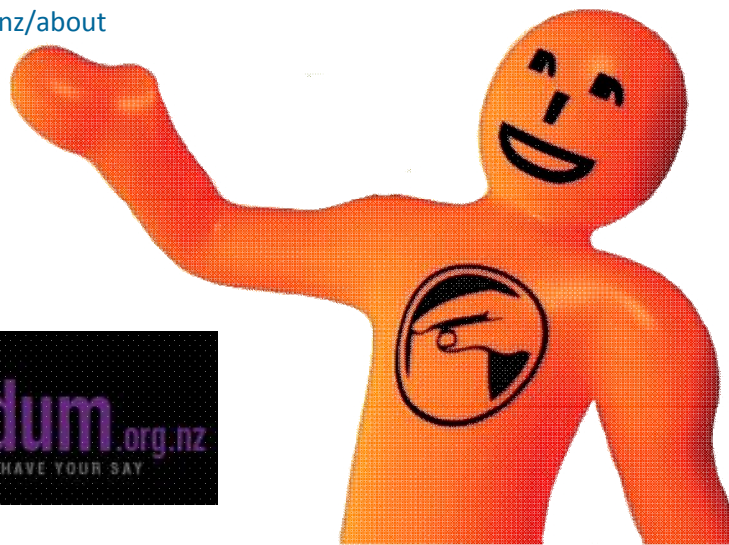

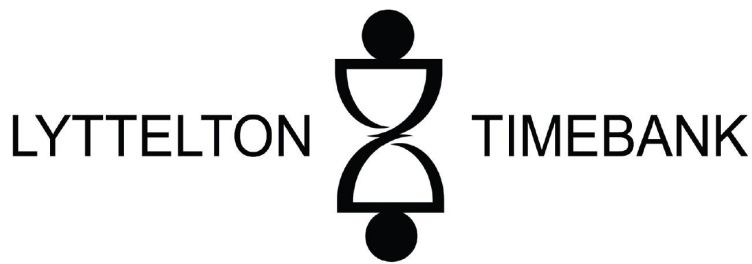

What is Time Banking?

Time Banking is a way of trading skills in a community. It uses time, rather than money, as the measurement tool. Members of a Time Bank share their skills with other members within the community and are given time credits for the work they do. With the credits they gain, each member can 'buy' someone else's time, and get the service they need.

Why Join Lyttelton Time Bank?


Time Banking adds a richness to Time Bankers' lives. As a concept it brings 'wealth', in the form of friendship, caring for one another, having our needs met from within our own community and getting help with things we can't do. Skills that are often taken for granted are valued - especially non-market economy skills - like mothering, basic home help and caring, friendliness, listening.


In Lyttelton as a result of the Time Bank we can see a tighter community forming. Friendships are forming between people of different backgrounds who would not usually have met. The elderly are being cared for and the skills they share are valued. Special needs people are encouraged to participate. Time Banking builds relationships and trust in a community. Everyone has something they can contribute to the wellbeing of the whole.


Everyone's Time is Equal


With Time Banking everybody's time is equal, no matter what type of work is done. 1 = 1. If you give one hour's work, you receive one hour time credit. If you have another member do one hour's work, they are paid one hour time credit. Every person is equally valued.

Here are a few examples of what Lyttelton Harbour residents are giving and receiving this week - can you help?

 Hi, I am trying to get hold of wine bottle corks - I drink screw tops ! Anybody who has wine corks or could put some aside for me this would be great. My intentions are to make a pin board for the kitchen. - says Kevin

 I have a photo of a knitted beanie ski hat with a knitted beard face cover that looks like a Viking helmet - I can't knit but would love to find someone that would attempt this, i'll supply everything that's needed. - says Kevin

 I have come across an old recording that is on tape, - the old fashioned ferro-magnetic tape, not a cassette but one that you would put in a reel to reel machine, if that makes sense? I was wondering if anyone out there has the equipment to put the recording into a digital format? (Or perhaps know where I could get this done). - says Celia

 We make fresh organic ice cream that we would love to share with others. The current flavours we have are caramel, chocolate, and vanilla that we can do in 500g freeze-able glass jars. We could also do a trade?? eggs for ice cream? milled flour for ice cream?? - says Christy & Giulio
