Sumner Road - Partial Road Closure to September

Seven Month Retaining Wall Replacement Project

Stronger Christchurch Infrastructure Rebuild Team [SCRIT] will begin rebuilding the retaining walls on Sumner Road in Lyttelton, starting 18 January 2012 for approximately seven months for the first Stage. Priority has been given to this first one hundred metre stretch of retaining wall as it supports St Davids Street and other right of ways. Retaining wall failures along Sumner Road will be rebuilt in four stages, with the first stage of the rebuild sited between the former Police Station and the intersection of Sumner Road and St Davids Street.

Sumner Road between Oxford Street and St Davids Street will be closed while the retaining wall is being repaired, so local vehicle traffic can only access Sumner Road via a detour via Reserve Terrace, Stevensons Steep, St Davids Street and Exeter Street. Vehicle access to non-site traffic will not be permitted, and residents from number 5 Sumner Road to number 24 Sumner Road have been requested to park outside the immediate work site.

Pedestrian access to the closed part of Sumner Road will be maintained at all times along the existing footpath on the southern side of the site and Sumner Road. Pedestrian access to properties for local residents in the immediate work site will be maintained.

The works will take place between 7.00am and 6.00pm, Monday to Saturday. The first stage is expected to finish by the end of August 2012. All works are subject to favourable weather and on-site construction conditions, and the work will result in increased dust, noise and vibration levels because of underground drilling.

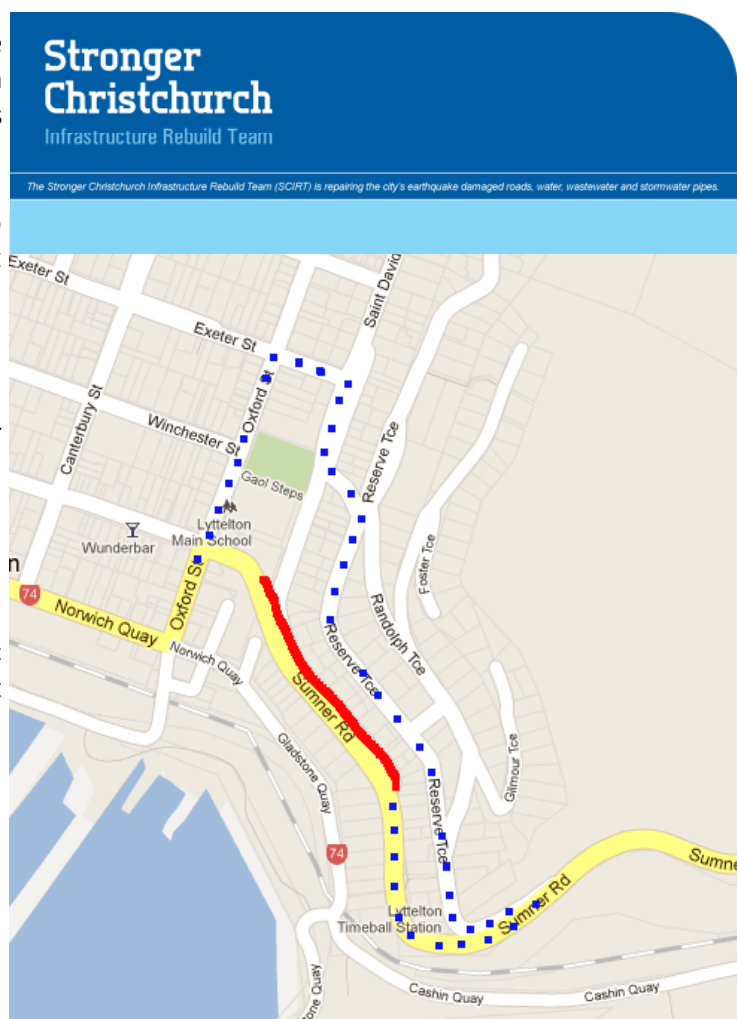

It is interesting to go back to buildings and places that have totally changed their functionality. In this instance we are referring to the Fletcher EQR Lyttelton Hub located on the corner of Dublin Street and Winchester Street, here in Lyttelton.

Memories of these buildings will recall a former pub and residential homes; but now the two houses are the bustling offices for twenty three employees of the Earthquake Recovery Team for Fletcher EQR. A myriad of contract supervisors, quantity surveyors, a planner, engineers, and administrators, all headed by the project manager are dotted throughout the two old houses, coordinating the earthquake repairs for homeowners with estimated damage costs between \$10,000 and \$100,000.

We were invited to take a look around the Lyttelton Fletcher EQR Hub by Belinda Thomas, the newly appointed Community Liaison Officer for the hub. Belinda has replaced Belinda Hunter who has been promoted to Project Manager of the Fletcher EQR Woolston Hub.

Much to our surprise Belinda has been based at this office for some time. Some of you might know her already from her work with the Clean Heat Project. After a short stint in the New Brighton Office Belinda is back in Lyttelton with this new role.

“Having worked in Lyttelton before with the Fletcher EQR team gives me the added advantage of knowing many people here”, Belinda says. The other great thing we discover with Belinda, [as we are so parochial in Lyttelton] is that she knows our area very well, having lived in Sumner for many years and now residing in Governors Bay. During our conversation, many joint connections are revealed.

A day in the life of our new Community Liaison Officer looks very busy. Starting at 8.30am it appears you just don't know what is going to cross the desk from day to day. Belinda explains that the main function of her role is facilitating the best outcomes for all parties during the rebuilding process. For Lyttelton and the Harbour region, this means that Belinda is here for us to support us through the many queries or issues that may arise during the Fletcher EQR repair process. Belinda explains this could be, helping you with issues when you need to move out, in particular providing repair information to your insurer if required. She is also our point of contact for any community information that Fletcher EQR has for the wider community. So no doubt during this year Belinda will be supplying the Lyttelton Review with relevant copy.

Lyttelton Fundraising initiative Takes Off

Community Garage Sales Pick Up Momentum

Have you checked out THE garage sale yet?

Each and every Saturday morning between 10.00am and 1.00pm, and now every Thursday afternoon from 2.00 to 4.00pm something magical happens at 54a Oxford Street in Lyttelton. The garage doors open and a treasure trove is revealed to the world. Volunteers arrive, donated goodies are brought out and arranged, and customers visit, browse, chat, laugh and shop.

But this is more than just a garage sale - every penny of the money goes directly to support community groups in the Lyttelton Harbour. On January 28th for example the Lyttelton Harbour Information Centre is going to run its first sale and we will put the money towards our various publications.

And, as this garage sale initiative is for fundraising in the Lyttelton Harbour regions, the garage [or sales area] can be booked by any group as a fundraiser. The group is required to manage the site, provide volunteers and open and close the site for the morning or afternoon – but will get to keep all the proceeds for their cause. Takings on a Saturday usually average somewhere between \$200 to \$500.

To date, groups that have run sales include: the Lyttelton Sea Scouts, the Community Garden, the Time bank, Lyttelton Community House, Volcano Radio, the eARTHquake Art Therapy Initiative, The Lyttelton Petanque Club and Lyttelton Main School camp.

Donations of quality second hand items [sorry no electrical or large items] are always most gratefully accepted and can be dropped at the Portal any time. The Portal is located at 54a Oxford Street [up the driveway behind the swimming pool] and for donations, there is a silver shed next to the steps for items to go in.

If you're having a spring clean and sort out please help your community to help itself by donating to the Lyttelton garage sale today! Pickups can be arranged on request.

If you are a member of a community group or club and are interested in booking a sale for your group please do get in touch with the Project Lyttelton Office on 328 9243.

The garage sale volunteer team are also in need of some more volunteers to help sort donations and run the show for both Thursdays between 2.00pm and 4.00pm and Saturdays between 10.00am and 1.00pm. If you could do a shift every now and then or a regular slot and are keen to be involved please do be in touch.

Since the garage sales began last year this community has raised \$8500 for nine different community initiatives. Thanks Lyttelton, your generous donations have enabled this money to be generated and distributed to our community groups.

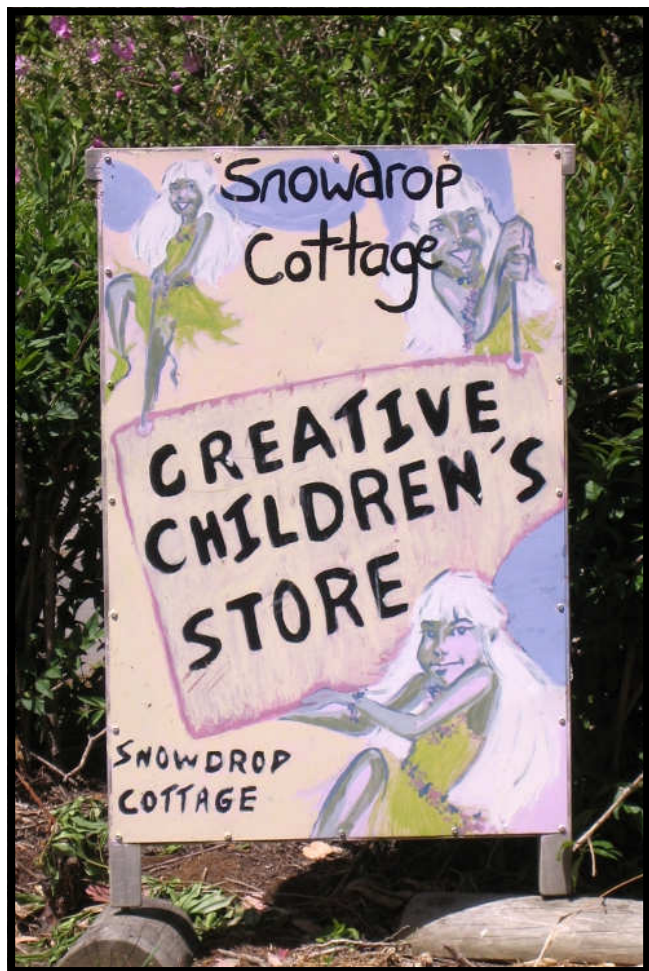

Climb the walls with your kids not because of them!

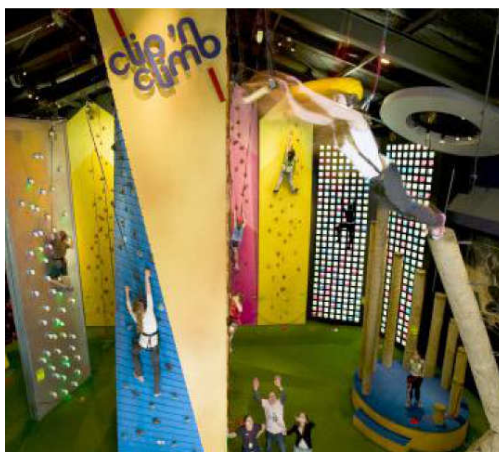
