
Lyttelton Tennis Courts

A Recreation Secret of Lyttelton West

It's great to see life returning to the Lyttelton Tennis Club again. A team of four mum's are behind the resurgence of the club. They are Jillian Frater, Lisa Mason, Kristi Calder and Lucie Ozanne. Their dream is to get loads of adults and children playing tennis again plus clean up the site and restore the old clubrooms for tennis users and the wider community. This team are working wonders for the old club. Jillian tells us how already this summer thirty children are coached every Thursday evening plus a group of four adults are as well. "The great thing about the courts is they are open to the public", said Jillian. Anyone is able to turn up to play tennis at almost any time that they like. This is a very different system to many of the clubs in neighbouring suburbs. It's a real community facility tucked into Lyttelton West. "There's often people using the courts, including quite a few who come through the tunnel to play", she said.

Local funders are also very attracted to what this team is trying to achieve. So far they have raised \$5000 from the Project Lyttelton Community Earthquake Fund and an amazing \$34,000 from the Vodafone community grants scheme for the restoration of the club rooms. Lyttelton Rotary also sponsored \$1,000 for tennis coaching and Lyttelton Lions is looking at ways to help as well. Talking to Jillian the club is also about building up the neighbourhood. If the tennis area looks nice more people will be attracted to the area and more activities will happen. We certainly witnessed that with the restoration of the playground, pool and community garden area in Oxford St.

If tennis is your thing and you'd like to help things move forward the team are currently looking for a project manager for the club rooms renovation. 16.8m [115tonne] Steel Fishing Trawler

Andrew Stark, Chief Executive of Stark Bros Ltd, Lyttelton, New Zealand, last week confirmed their new 16.8 metre Steel Fishing Trawler - F.V. LEGACY, will be launched on Tuesday 21st February 2012. The vessel has been designed and built by Stark Bros in their Lyttelton Ship Building facility for Ocean Fisheries Ltd, an associated company of some 45 years. They have chosen this name principally in recognition of the Legacy that Frank Stark created - successful Boat Building, Ship Repair, Transport, and Commercial Fishing businesses.

It will be a special day, not only is the FV Legacy the 1st new build since Frank passed away in 2008, but the launching will also coincide with the retirement of John Hall, their boat building foreman who joined the company as an apprentice in 1963, some 49 years ago. Liz Stark will perform the official launching duties, the 1st time she did this was as Franks fiancée, when she launched the FV Bluewater in 1967 which was the 1st commercial fishing boat Stark's built for their then new fishing company Ocean Fisheries. Her role on this very special occasion will therefore reinforce the legacy created, and now being continued and developed by Franks remaining family.

With the ongoing drought of new fishing trawlers in NZ, the FV Legacy is the latest in the line of new fishing vessels from Stark Bros – following the FV Frontier in 2004, the FV Jubilee in 2008, the FV Nessie J in 2009. The FV LEGACY once again represents a multi-million dollar investment in the inshore fishery. The FV Legacy is equipped with a very fuel efficient SCANIA DI12 59M, coupled to a 9:1 gearbox driving a huge 1800mm diameter variable pitch propeller, designed to give significant fuel savings. An onboard salt water ice maker, computer controlled split hydraulic winches with auto scrolling, and will fish the varied conditions and fishing grounds particular to the East Coast South Island of New Zealand, fishing in

depths from 10m to about 500m.

The FV LEGACY is also the first fishing trawler in NZ to be fitted with a 160khz WASSP multi-beam sonar system with advanced NAVIGATOR 2D/3D seabed profiling software. This system enables the skipper to see real time 3D images of the seabed, which will enable more efficient and productive fishing. The system was developed by Electronic Navigation Ltd (ENL) of Auckland, a 100% New Zealand owned company, and is becoming a best seller around the world for many sea based applications.

Stark Bros are proud to install this NZ Developed Technology, and look forward to the results, which all going to plan will see Ocean Fisheries fitting these units to their other vessels in the near future.

As with their other fishing boats the Legacy will also run on a B60 blend — that is 60% Bio-diesel with 40% petroleum diesel, locally grown and supplied by BioDiesel New Zealand

Beyond GDP - A Genuine Progress Indicator for New Zealand

Most "developed" country governments, put economic growth at the head of their policy objectives. In recent years, evidence from these countries has been mounting that the environmental and social costs of production of goods and services have actually been growing faster than the benefits. This process has been described as increasing "illth" faster than "wealth", thereby making us all poorer, rather than richer. One important reason for this is faulty national accounting via use of the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) measure. Professor Murray Patterson, will describe in a non-technical way the principles of the approach and the main conclusions. These will be of for rebuilding Christchurch for a sustainable future.
