Harbour Sediment Pollution

Storm Water Management Under the Spotlight

Last week Paula Smith made a deputation to the Banks Peninsula Water Management Zone Committee to express her concerns over the continued sediment build up in the Lyttelton Harbour. Most of you will know Paula as the Chairperson of the Lyttelton Mt Herbert Community Board, but last weeks deputation was not as an elected member, but as a concerned Diamond Harbour resident. Formerly practicing as a Landscape Architect, with a background in plant ecology, Paula made reference to the quality of the harbour long term residents of Lyttelton will remember: fishing in the harbour; gathering food from the harbour; and recollections of the ferry to Governors Bay. As the harbour has filled with sediment [and based on some calculations this could be an astounding 35cm every year for the past 50 years] the varieties of fish have all but gone and left behind the spiny dogfish; many of the dolphins, whales and penguins have relocated to Akaroa; and the Lyttelton Harbour has infilled with 47 metres of sediment in modern times, making it too shallow for ferries to travel past Quail Island.

While some long term Lyttelton residents believe the build up of sediment occurs due to continual dredging of the Harbour, the Lyttelton Port Company says its activities do not contribute significantly to the harbour's sediment inputs compared with historic practices. Continued dredging is necessary as there is so much sediment sloshing about in the harbour from land-based sources, the shipping channel acts as a sink. Keeping the channel clear of sediment creates a significant ongoing cost for the port.

Paula believes that sediment entering the harbour via the streams of the Lyttelton catchment is one of the most serious water quality issues in Banks Peninsula, up there with Wairewa eutrophication, and it seems to go largely unrecognised and unacknowledged. In order to move forward a shift in attitude toward our harbour waters, and an increased awareness of sediment pollution needs to occur. In presenting her deputation, Paula put forward seven recommendations to the Banks Peninsula Water Management Zone Committee, and asks that an issue for adoption is "a measured reduction in sediment input to Lyttelton Harbour".

Civil Defence

A New Beginning

The earthquakes have brought so much change. Many of us are reviewing how we have done things, how we can improve, should we move on. From our personal lives to the organisations we work for everything is in this state of flux.

Civil Defence is no exception. Change is happening from the top to the grass roots. At the local level Ken Maynard has just retired after many years of service as our Area Co-ordinator. The local branch had a celebration to acknowledge Ken's many years of service and his terrific efforts during the state of emergency in February 2011.

Stepping up to the challenge of Area Co-ordinator is Julie Lee [aka Jules]. Lyttelton's former Time bank Co-ordinator Jules will be well known to many of you. Ken passes the baton into great hands and describes Jules as Lyttelton's "Tour de Force". Kens responsibilities were much larger than Jules thought. They encompass Civil Defence needs for the entire Lyttelton Harbour. Jules immediate challenge will be to coordinate a harbour wide emergency management plan for our communities needs. This will involve all of us and will be our chance to develop a system that reflects what works best for us.

At the National organisation level there is the realisation that the grass roots networks need more autonomy. Julie Lee is going to have more freedom to create the type of Civil Defence network that best suits the needs of this harbour.

"Civil Defence is moving away from its prescriptive model" said Jules. "We have the opportunity to open things up". She is really excited about the possibilities. Fun is something that she plans to embed in the new organisation. She also dreams of much closer links with community organisations around our harbour so that we can create a more connected and dynamic organisation. One instant change for the organisation is that Jules and her team of volunteers can open up a civil defence post whenever they think there is a need. In the past Ken had to wait for approval to do that. In the meantime there are all sorts of local issues that need to be sorted. Currently there is no sector post in Lyttelton with the Recreation Centre closed!

In the last week new developments already include a Lyttelton Harbour Community Civil Defence Face book page http://www.facebook.com/ LytteltonHarbourCommunityCivilDefence. Check on progress for a new sector post and all things local Civil Defence. Monthly meeting dates have also been set, pencil in the second Monday of the month from 7.00pm to 9.00pm at the St John's Ambulance station in London Street. If you'd like to be a part of the organisation as it redefines itself, now is the time to get involved. Yummy home baked supper to be provided. If meetings aren't for you Jules would still like to hear from you as she is coming up with a cunning plan that caters for all who are keen to be involved, in whatever capacity.

Numbers given are the property numbers closest to the proposed work site.

Canterbury Street Ripon Street	No. 62 No. 15-23	No. 65-77	No. 91-93	SCIRT expect to have the details finalised on these walls over the next few months, then activity should start.
London Street St David's Street Ticehurst Road	No. 80 No. 10 No. 16	No. 30	No. 37-39	SCIRT still have several months of preparation work for these walls, and it will be mid 2012 before any physical work will begin.

Print Making Workshops

With Melanie Riley at Orton Bradley Park

Mixed media printmaking combines several techniques together to create unique prints.

- Inks are rolled onto a printing plate and wiped, scratched into before printing. This can be repeated again [with different colours] to print over your first print.
- A second plate with modelling paste is then inked and printed onto your first print.
- The second plate is worked into with old brushes, sticks, etc and allowed to dry. The scratching and brushing allows for a
 painterly or drawn surface. Textured materials can also be pressed into wet modelling paste.
- Decorative paper can be glued onto blank paper before printing over. You will be working within a square composition format.




plenty to share


