Attracted by Lyttelton's Culture of Possibilities

Bonnie Singh is a most remarkable young woman. Some of you might recognise her name. She is a survivor of a building collapse from the February 2011 earthquake. In the face of personal adversity and the loss of her work colleague Matti, Bonnie has come back stronger and more positive than you can imagine.

Bonnie Singh has lost that fear that often holds you back from doing things. Bonnie tells us that she is fully determined to make her life enjoyable. Passion just flows from Bonnie and she tells us confidently that this has taught her that she can do anything. “What I have got now is complete freedom. Prior to the earthquakes I would never have dreamed of moving to Lyttelton or starting my own business,” she said. So from someone who had always lived on the other side of town, she’s now moved to Lyttelton to begin a new business and lifestyle!.

Bonnie’s journey with Lyttelton was linked to her recovery. Regular appointments at Robyn Kerr’s acupuncture clinic did the trick. During these visits she began to discover Lyttelton and realise what a neat, unique and supportive place this was. Bonnie was hooked and as her health improved she wanted to get back to her chosen profession of tattooing and live here.

One thing led to another. First Bonnie had to convince her female co-workers from Southern Ink to join her in Lyttelton. They had already decided they wanted to work as a team it was just finding the right location. They wanted a special place. Amazingly Bonnie said it didn’t take too much convincing for Jak and Emma to agree to start the business in Lyttelton. Bonnie then put it out to the universe and wonderful people came and helped her achieve her new goal. Rachel Williamson from Auckland invested in this new business. People from all walks of life have been inspired by Bonnie and the team and they want them to get up and running again. Their kindness has enabled the team to renovate and create their new tattoo shop in Lyttelton called “Maids of Ink”. They will be the first female only tattoo team in the entire country.

Each of them brings special styles to the business. The new shop is located in the basement of the former Small Business Accounting shop. A quick visit and it’s completely transformed down there. The team is going to have the most fantastic working space. Plans are to open this Saturday, December 1. They have big celebrations organised. An open day will mark the occasion and they have RDU coming to town, plus sponsorship from Hell’s Pizza, visits from muso’s and other supporters plus many other spontaneous things that will no doubt happen. The grand opening of Maids of Ink is a significant milestone on many fronts. It is a celebration of life, a memory of Matti, a new business for Lyttelton, plus Bonnie and her family have relocated here to become part of our wider community. Maids of Ink will be open Monday to Saturday from December 1, at 31 London St. Pop down and visit to show your support.

Not Any Ordinary Portrait

Artist Profile: Gillian Taylor

Lyttelton is home for many talented artists, and this week the Lyttelton Review talks to Gillian Taylor. Some of you will know Gillian, as she is a regular at the Lyttelton Grassy Market, and is one of the Lyttelton Farmers Market Saturday managers. But most notably, Gillian excels in the world of digital fine art portraits.

Now to set the record straight, Gillian's portrait work is delightfully far from ordinary. Having successfully finished her Diploma in Professional Photography in 2010, Gillian was invited to be 2011 Artist in Residence at the CPIT School of Art and Design. She was then awarded the Will Cumming Memorial First Prize, and highly commended in the Mortlock McCormack Art Awards. Gillian's work is both unique and highly appreciated by clients and the arts community alike.

Gillian tells us she is drawn to portraiture because of her interest in people, and that "a portrait can bring so much pleasure to the subject, their family and friends. My aspiration is to produce beautiful, timeless portraits that remain treasured by the individual and their family, and by the generations that follow." Gillian enjoys the challenge of creating a portrait that reveals some aspect of the person's character and individuality. She aims to create portraits "that tell a story about a person that is alive with their personality, and where the viewer looks into their eyes and feels a sense of communication".

Drawing inspiration from each individual person and their chosen costume, Gillian uses historical artworks from the public domain, that are selected because of their connection with the person, or links to their origins, family history or current interests.

At the moment, Gillian is exhibiting her latest collection "Pirates of Lyttelton" at Roots Restaurant on London Street. This ongoing series of work was inspired by the community of Lyttelton. Lyttelton as the port of Christchurch was badly affected by recent earthquakes, but it survives as a supportive community through the strength and resilience of its people. A little known fact is that a number "pirates" live here in Lyttelton. When Gillian became interested in portraying them, the series grew through word of mouth. "Pirates", some of whom she had not met before, were more than enthusiastic to become involved. When invited to participate they would arrive at Gillian's home already in the full pirate dress you see in the portraits, with one person even offering to bring his cannon as a prop.

Gillian works from her home studio on Cressy Terrace and accommodates individuals, families, groups and even your loved pet for her portrait work. If you are looking for something a little less ordinary in portrait work, as a special gift for a loved one, or art on your own wall, then you surely will not be disappointed in the artistic talents of Gillian Taylor.

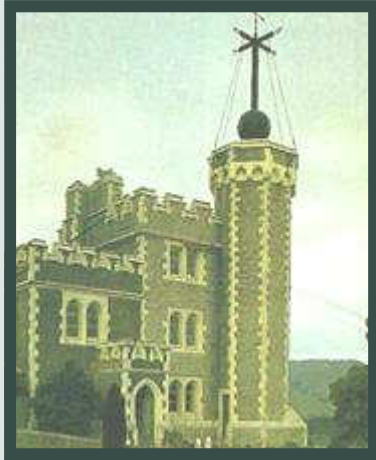

Community Board Returns to Lyttelton Base

Lyttelton Mt Herbert Community Board Meetings in Lyttelton

Lyttelton Mt Herbert Community Board members are glad to be meeting in Lyttelton once again. Since the closure of the Lyttelton Service Centre, and then the Lyttelton Recreation Centre, the Board has been meeting at various locations in the Lyttelton Mt Herbert area including Living Springs, Diamond Harbour War Memorial Hall and the Governors Bay Hotel.

The Community Board's new meeting room is at 15 London Street [formally a real estate office]. Christchurch City Council is renting this property as a temporary service centre and a counter will shortly be set up in the front office for doing Council business. Our local Strengthening Communities Advisers will also be working there.

The boardroom will be available for use by other community groups outside office hours, by arrangement.

Our **last meeting** of the year is to be held in the afternoon of **13 December, starting at 1.30pm**. Community Board meetings are open to the public and copies of the agenda are available at the meeting. The agenda is always available for people to have a look at in the library, service centre or on the Council website for about a week before each meeting.

The statutory role of the Community Board is to represent, and advocate for, the interests of the community. Our community includes people living in Lyttelton, all the other settlements around the Harbour and Port Levy. We speak on behalf of this community not just to Christchurch City Council but also to any organisation, agency or individual who might be able to help us further the interests of the community we represent.

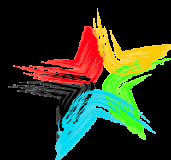
Any person or group can formally raise a matter of community interest or concern with the Community Board by writing to us or by making an appointment to speak to the board for up to ten minutes at the beginning of a meeting. This is called a "deputation".

People also have an opportunity to talk to board members at our informal community board "clinics" held monthly at the big table in the Lyttelton Library. **The next clinic is on Thursday 6 December from 5.00pm to 6.00 pm**. If you just want to email or give a board member a ring, you can find elected member contact information next to our photographs on the Lyttelton Mt Herbert page of the Christchurch City Council website or you can get these details from the lovely ladies at the Lyttelton Service Centre.

Community Champions for Emergency Resilience

Taking a Closer Look at Wider Community Emergency Planning

Emergency preparedness was a key goal identified for the Lyttelton Harbour area in Lyttelton's Master Plan. The process got underway on Tuesday with a community workshop facilitated by Christchurch City Council's Civil Defence and Emergency Management team.

The workshop was the start of a conversation between community groups about what they want to see in our community emergency action plan. It was clear that two streams of work need to be addressed. Plans for actual emergencies, who does what, where are the resources, etc, and plans for longer term community resilience.

The aim of the plan is to give our entire community greater clarity about the roles and responsibilities we all have to ensure our communities are more resilient and prepared.

To develop the ideas further a community led steering group was formed on Tuesday. Wendy Everingham agreed to lead the process and so far she is joined by Alicia Palmer, Andrea Wild, Andrew Turner, Arthur Turner, Frances James, Greg Skene, John Barry, Julie Lee, Lesley Milan, Lucy Ozanne, Margaret Jefferies and Roy Montgomery.

Lyttelton Master Plan Implementation

Update No.2

Lyttelton Master Plan
Suburban Centres Programme

Welcome to the second of Christchurch City Council's regular progress updates on Lyttelton Master Plan implementation.

What's been happening?

Progress to date on actions from the Lyttelton Master Plan by both the Council and community-based project leaders includes:

- C9 Emergency preparedness:** A community workshop was held at the Naval Point Yacht Club on 20 November 2012 to help inform the drafting of Lyttelton's Community Emergency Action Plan. See the article on previous page for further information.
- C10 Tangata whenua relationships, values and aspirations:** Discussions have started with Te Hapū o Ngāti Wheke regarding how to best progress this action.
- B3 Local input into design and appearance:** On 25 October 2012, the Council agreed to further funding, and widening the terms of reference for, the existing Urban Design Panel rather than the establishment of localised urban design panels. Local input into the design and appearance of development within Lyttelton's Town Centre Zone, including modified and new buildings, will be provided via the Lyttelton-specific design guidelines in the District Plan (its pending update in particular), on which the Urban Design Panel will rely when assessing proposed development. This decision does not prevent local design professionals from being consulted and providing input regarding detailed design, etc, in respect to Lyttelton Master Plan actions such as the new civic square, London Street public realm enhancements and Naval Point amenity improvements when they occur.

What's happening now?

Work in progress includes:

- M3 Pedestrian linkages:** Council staff are investigating how this action could be funded and achieved.
- N1 A new civic square, (C4) New public amenities in the town centre and (C5) Lyttelton War Memorial Cenotaph relocation investigation and reinstatement:** Council staff are currently considering the makeup of the team of professionals who will progress the design of the new civic square.

What's coming up?

Watch out for further information on the following:

- N5 Temporary landscapes:** The Council has agreed to funding for a transitional project on the new civic square site. It will meet numerous objectives of the Lyttelton Master Plan by (i) engaging local artists and crafts people to (ii) create and trial the possible future design of street furniture, play equipment, public artwork, lighting, etc, that complements whatever the community already has on site informally and which (iii) provides a vehicle to reflect Lyttelton's character and identity. The resulting street furniture, etc, could be relocated elsewhere within Lyttelton in future if not incorporated in the permanent design of the space. This will result in better interim utilisation of the space for the community and get people thinking about how they would like the space to be utilised in the future, which will also help the Council with the pre-construction design work.

What can I do?

The Lyttelton Master Plan provides a community-agreed vision and framework within which the Council, organisations and individuals can make decisions that contribute towards Lyttelton's rebuild and recovery. Familiarise yourself with its vision, goals and actions; keep up to date on its implementation by reading these articles (amongst other communications); participate in further community consultation and decision-making as the opportunities arise; and contact Janine Sowerby about how your redevelopment or actions could contribute to its implementation.

The Brigade: A Tribute to the Lyttelton Volunteer Fire Brigade

Fundraising Book Available Now

So much has been written about the February 22 earthquake and its aftermath, but The Brigade tells the untold story of the men and women of the Lyttelton Volunteer Fire Brigade who found themselves at the very centre of the disaster.

The book has been compiled by brigade member Alastair Suren who has brought together the stories and recollections of individual brigade members, as they recount their experiences of that day and the days that followed.

Each story is unique, as brigade members recall where they were when the earthquake struck, how they responded to the unfolding crisis and how they balanced the needs of the community they serve with the needs of their own families. Together these stories build a picture of one community's response to a disaster while at the same time giving us an insight into what it means to be part of a New Zealand volunteer fire brigade.

Brigade member Alastair Suren had the foresight to take his camera with him in the first response to the quake and the following days and weeks, many of these images are used in conjunction with others taken by locals, other brigade members and photographs. The imagery used in this book reinforces, with startling honest, the volunteers stories, the challenges, the camaraderie and at times sheer exhaustion, all set against the backdrop of Lyttelton's shattered landscape.

They say that this is a nation run by volunteers. Never has this been truer than in the aftermath of February 22. Through the pages of The Brigade we get an insight into how the members of one group of volunteers rose to an unprecedented challenge and also how the fabric of our communities is woven from these threads – and for that reason The Brigade is a small but vital part of our contemporary social history.

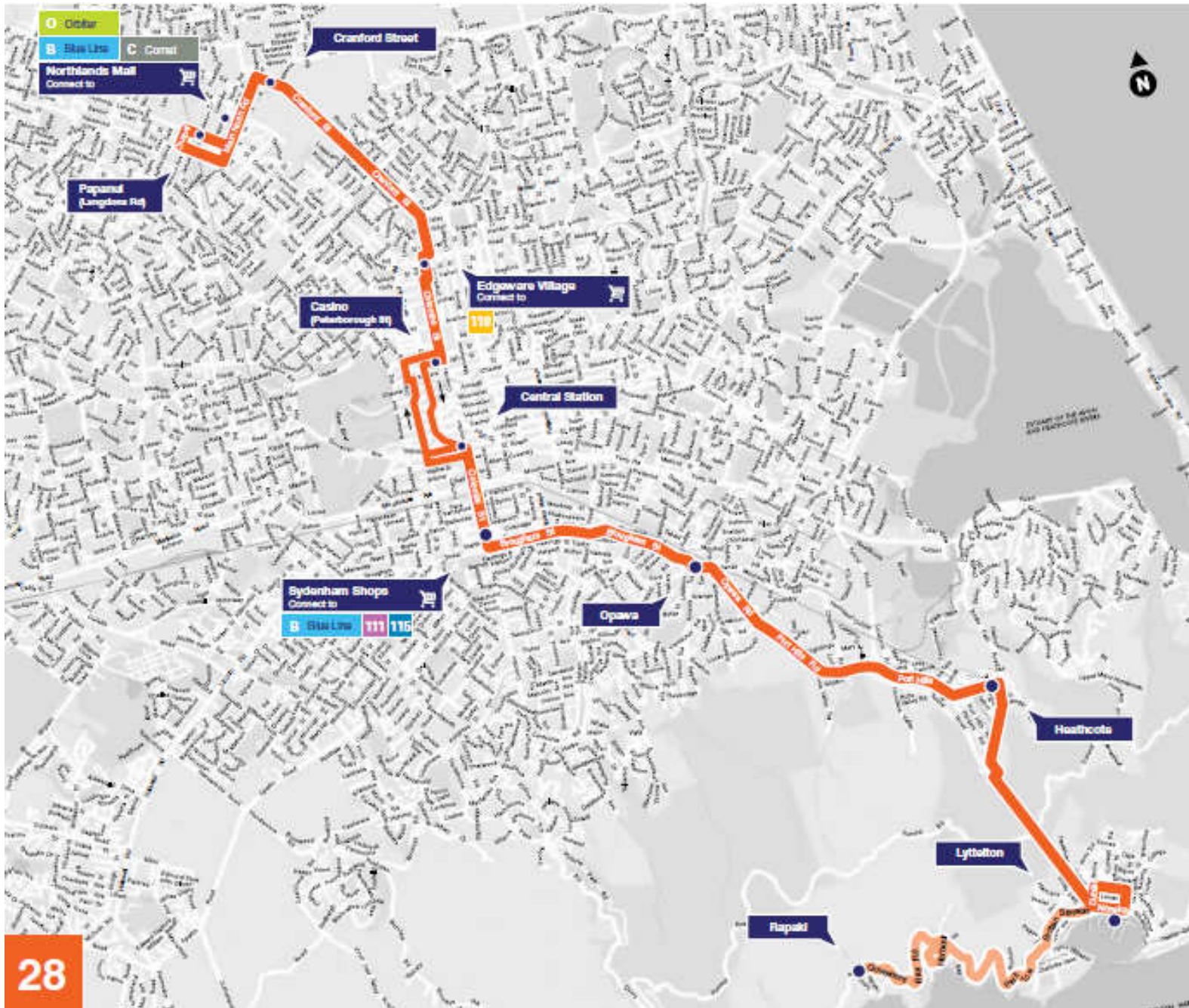

Signing Off Fletcher EQR Work

It's come to our attention that there is some confusion about when to sign off on completed repairs by Fletcher EQR Home Repair. The following is an excerpt from a presentation by Fletcher's EQR to CERA:

Once work is complete, the EQR supervisor and contractor, along with the property owner, inspect the repair work. Then, provided all parties are satisfied with the work completed, the repairs are signed off by the home owner.

There is 90-day defects liability period - all repairs must comply with the Building Act 2004. If a property owner isn't happy with the work they contact EQR in the first instance. If they remain dissatisfied, they can then contact EQC.

Some contractors may ask home owners to undertake an inspection with them prior to the EQR sign off, forming part of the contractor's quality assurance process. Formal sign off that the repairs have been completed is carried out with the home owner, contractor and EQR representative present.

EQC advises customers not to sign off on repairs before all of the work has been completed.

Land Use Recovery Plan for Greater Christchurch

Environment Canterbury has received a direction from the Canterbury Earthquake Recovery Minister, Gerry Brownlee, to develop a Land Use Recovery Plan for greater Christchurch. Commissioner Peter Skelton says Environment Canterbury welcomes the opportunity to develop the plan together with its strategic partners, and to include the wider community in that process. "This plan is vital to facilitate earthquake recovery," Professor Skelton said. "There is an urgent need for greater certainty regarding land use and infrastructure in greater Christchurch.

"Significant investment decisions that are currently being made, including by the Stronger Christchurch Infrastructure Rebuild Team and by the three territorial authorities, will be assisted by the plan. In addition, the needs of people and businesses seeking to relocate and relocate are pressing, and the plan will provide focus for decision making in this area." The recovery plan will respond to the impacts of the earthquakes on residential and business land use, and provide a platform for transitioning from rebuild to longer term planning.

"The focus will be on ensuring provision for a diverse range of housing types; infrastructure and transport is integrated and connected to land use; centres of activity are supported, and consideration of natural hazards underpins land use decision making," Professor Skelton said. The plan will identify the location, type and mix of residential and business activities within specific geographic areas that are necessary for earthquake recovery, and make changes necessary for earthquake recovery to residential and business land use policy and planning provisions and related funding instruments.

Professor Skelton said the partners will be talking with key stakeholders before Christmas. A consultation document will be available for public input and a series of workshops in early 2013. A draft recovery plan will be presented to the Minister by the middle of next year, when he will call for written comments before considering the draft plan.

Design Your Own Eco Home: Workshop

This two and a half day **Design Your Own Eco Home Workshop** will help you develop a concept design for a new home that is healthier for you, your family and the environment. It involves both theory sessions and practical design sessions facilitated by experienced designers. The workshops are also open to "information only" participants, that is, for those who do not have a current project to work on.

About the Workshop

This workshop will present inspirational and practical information about healthier and more sustainable building. You will learn about what is involved in designing an Eco Home and the process involved in building one. Close interaction with experienced designers will help you to develop ideas for your own home. The workshop is divided into five teaching sessions: Introduction, Site Planning, Energy Design, Materials and Electrical/Plumbing. The workshop is ended with a completion session for presentation and discussion of projects. The first half of each session introduces the theoretical and practical aspects of Ecological Building and Design. You will learn about various options and the practical issues around these choices. Comprehensive notes are provided for the theory sessions. The second half of each session is more interactive. Individual design projects will be discussed in small groups with designers and workshop instructors. Site information, design briefs and newly acquired Eco building ideas are transformed into design concepts, which gradually work towards creating an initial house design.

Alexander Greig – Architect and Building Biologist. Alex is a practising architect in Wellington and is the director of the Building Biology and Ecology Institute. He has been successfully using the design process taught in the workshop for the last eleven years. He is assisted in the workshop by local experts in the field of sustainable building and local designers.

Before the workshop you will be given an **introductory design pack** including questions and activities to help you start thinking about your home design. Through collecting ideas and images of building forms, materials and interiors you will begin develop your own "pattern language" and clarify your preferences. Report Gives History before the Treaty was Signed

On 28 November 2012, the far north Ngāpuhi Nui Tonu kaumatua will be presented with a very significant independent report based on the evidence presented to the Waitangi Tribunal during hearings since 2010 of *Claim Wai 1040*, concerned with the Crown's assumed basis of its right to govern. The issues raised in this claim could have profound constitutional implications for Aotearoa as a whole.

The Waitangi Tribunal is a government-appointed body. Therefore Ngāpuhi Nui Tonu kaumatua decided to appoint an independent panel to listen to the Tribunal hearings and write an additional report documenting fully the evidence of elders presented at the hearing.

The Independent Panel, comprising two kaumatua, Hori Parata(Ngati Wai) and Takawai Murphy (Ngati Manawa) and two Pakeha colleagues from the independent Te Tiriti o Waitangi educators network, Dr Ingrid Huygens and Dr Susan Healy, attended all the Waitangi Tribunal hearings on Wai 1040, conducted research and wrote the report. Published as a 400 page book with the title Ngāpuhi Speaks, this will be a major educational resource as well as a significant historical and political analysis

About Ngāpuhi

Ngāpuhi is the largest populated iwi with 122,211 members, an increase of roughly 18.7 percent from 2001. Of these nearly two-thirds say that Ngāpuhi is the only iwi they belong to. Ngāti Porou and Ngāti Kahungunu are the next two largest iwi with 71,910 and 59,946 members respectively.

The Ngāpuhi iwi takiwa boundaries cover the middle far north district from South Hokianga through to Mangakāhia, across to the Bay of Islands to the south-western Whāngarei district. While this area is the 'home' of Ngāpuhi, 80% live in other parts of the country, mainly around the Auckland region, the Waikato and the Bay of Plenty.
